The work period can be defined in terms of the subject (e.g., spelling, math) or a number of minutes. The teacher can rate the child in various ways: numerically (e.g., 1 or 0; a 2- or 3-point scale) or simply yes/no in terms of whether or not the desired behavior appears. Reinforcers can be selected by the child from a menu that has been developed either by the teacher or by the teacher and child together.
